#### **General Business:**

- Trust Waikato have new premises if we need a bigger area.
- Peter Billings asked if we could have a workshop for getting photos off phones etc.

There is a gadget night coming up with Jacqui's son in attendance who will be able to help with all things techo.

- Janet Greenwood asked where all the people for skills nights were coming from.
   Jacqui explained the work she has done with advertising the club and skills nights through facebook, eventfinder, Hamilton Press etc.
- Different advertising is required to be directed at young people.
- Emil Zahariev (new member) mentioned he was interested in guest speakers, and did we ever have them.

Jacqui explained that we haven't been in a position to book speakers with the declining membership, but now numbers are improving, we may be able to look at some options with more chance of people coming along.

Rose Kerin asked why people weren't attending field trips.

It was felt that people had busy lives, and it was personal choice whether or not people wanted to travel for field trips. We are trying to make field trips more local to reduce travel and time spent.

- Field trips are geared towards competition topics.
- Shirley Warner asked for dates of field trips to be provided in advance further for planning.
- Annette Evans asked for competitions to be loaded as events on facebook.

Jacqui explained that they already are.

- Janet Greenwood mentioned that they did not get an email reminder for the BBQ. An email was, however sent out to all members.
- John Greenwood mentioned that there used to be field trips that were for 2/3 days.

  Jacqui explained that we have tried to engender interest in these, but without peoples commitment in advance, it is impossible to book accommodation and the like, so it just doesn't work at this stage.

- Josh York mentioned how the website will make life a lot easier for members and non-members once it's upgraded.

- Mary Lorier commented that when she was looking for details about the photography club, the website was quite off putting, and she didn't feel it was at all welcoming.
